

## YOUR SQUARE DANCE APPAREL Style

New Dancers .....Although the Trade N Buy was last month you still have an opportunity to purchase more "gently used" square dance outfits at the **Teen Scholarship Dance** on July 12<sup>th</sup> in Katy. The dance will be held where the Katy Promenaders dance at Westland Baptist Church located at 1407 W. Grand Parkway S., Katy. Following is an article from the owner of Rhythm Creations, Jimette Smith, that might help you with some choices.

For a new dancer, square dance clothes can seem quite daunting. They are a totally different concept than street wear because they are a costume. The trick to looking good in square dance outfits is getting the proportions right. A skirt that is too short looks like a tutu and one that is too long looks frumpy. A dancer should wear the shortest length that looks good because the longer the skirt, the heavier she will look.

Skirts are usually measured from below the waistband and should match in length to a petticoat measured from top to bottom. This is so you can wear the petticoat at the bottom of the skirt waistband (staggered) and not have all the elastics in one place. This makes the petticoat flush with the bottom of the skirt. You should be able to see the

petticoat on the curve but not hanging below the hem of the skirt.

- Blouses should be somewhat loose with plenty of room to move in the shoulders and armholes.
- A belt will cover the skirt waistband and finish off the outfit.
- If you want to determine your ideal skirt length and size, please feel free to come by Rhythm Creations and I will be glad to spend some time with you and show you how it all works together.

# Is Tradition Killing Square Dancing?

A **tradition** is a <u>belief</u> or behavior passed down within a group or society with symbolic meaning or special significance with origins in the past. Tradition gives us historical reference and helps to preserve the heritage to pass to the next generation. Tradition can also have a negative side, just because something has always been done a certain way does not mean it cannot be improved. Each generation should be able to embrace their heritage and improve it for the next generation.

The population makeup of Houston is changing. The 2013 Kinder Institute Houston Area survey published by Rice University has been tracking the economic and demographic transformation of Houston for 32 years. Their research indicates that no city more clearly exemplifies the trends that are rapidly refashioning the social and political landscape across all of urban America. In the course of the next 20 years, the Houston-Galveston Area Council forecasts that Harris County will add another one million residents, and another 3.5 million will move into the ten-county area as a whole. In 2010 the U.S. Census counted 4.1 million people in Harris County, of whom 33% were non-Hispanic whites, 41% were Hispanic, 18% African-American, and 8% Asian or other. Houston has suddenly become the most ethnically diverse metropolitan region in the country.

What do all these facts and figures have to do with square dancing? The number of dancers is dwindling. Interest in the activity has waned through the years. HSRDC peaked with 65 clubs in the mid-60's and down to 21 today. Is it possi-

ble that the activity is dying because as a group, square dancers are not reaching out to the diverse groups in the Houston population to encourage participation. Are we so steeped in tradition that we can break away from the stigma of being old-fashioned and "country." We need to encourage the diverse population in Houston to square dance. We need to reach out to the community and welcome all dancers and potential dancers.

Modern square dancing began in the late 1940's although it has it roots in folk dancing of all ages. Contra dancing, Quadrille, country "line" dancing in England all influenced what we now call modern square dancing. The beginning of square dancing had 16 basic calls. "Modern square dancing" is not that old and can certainly benefit from even more modernizing, creating new customs and traditions and being more accepting of diversity.

Modern Western square dancing is young, only having been around since the 1940's. Popularity for square dancing peaked in the late-1960's and through our bicentennial year, 1976. Since then, many clubs have folded and many of those still around are scrambling to keep members.

Music is a fundamental part of square dancing. Many still perceive square dance music as being the twangy and country music of the past. If anyone has danced to Paul Cote, you know that's not the case. He (and others) develop calls to modern popular music. As dancers, encourage your caller to incorporate new and modern music into his/her repertoire. As in any other profession, callers need to continuously update their music and their singing calls to stay on top of their game. The status-quo is boring. Some callers rely on the same music and the same calls each week. If we want this activity to grow, we need to have new, modern music and fun dancing. As dancers, if you hear a song you think

would make a good square dance, suggest it to a caller. He/she may be interested in developing new singing calls or using it for patter. Dancing needs to be fun for the dancer and if people don't like the music, or if they are bored with the same six songs week after week, they are more likely to quit dancing out of sheer boredom. Dancing does not have to be plus or advanced to be fun. A good caller can make mainstream dancing a lot of fun.

Modern Western square dance has developed a "look" that has become known as "traditional square dance attire", a "look" that has nothing really to do with traditional square dancing. This style of dress developed when square dance's popularity in the United States increased after World War II, and began soaring during the '50s and early '60s. Several factors may have helped influence the look that has become known as "traditional square dance attire". These include the visibility and popularity of square dance performers such as Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw's traveling troupe of "teenage cowboy square dancers"; the way square dancing and the west were portrayed in western movies and early television; and the popular clothing styles of those times, for example poodle skirts. Modern dancers do not necessarily want to wear "traditional square dance attire." Have you priced a petticoat lately? Have you worn a petticoat in Houston in 100 degree heat with 90% humidity. These are factors that discourage potential dancers. Not to mention some people just feel silly wearing that attire when they are traveling to/from a dance or eating out before and after. Square dancing is a social activity and people should feel comfortable. Fashion has changed over the years and so should square dance apparel. People should feel comfortable wearing what they want to wear and others should be tolerant. This does not mean that people should wear their gardening clothes. As in any other activity, use common sense.

Encourage your new dancers. It's a fun activity. New dancers should feel welcome. New dancers get easily discouraged. This activity requires commitment to learn the calls, commitment to improve your dancing. You cannot become a good dancer dancing less than two hours a week. New dancers need to be encouraged to visit other clubs and to practice at every opportunity. But it has to be fun. Some callers make learning not so fun. Callers and dancers have a responsibility to help and encourage new dancers. Callers cannot call out or pick on students who are making mistakes. That's a good way to lose students. If a student is having trouble with a call, someone (be it the class coordinator or other club members) help them by demonstration, walking them through the call, whatever it takes. Clubs, have on-going workshops of calls. One club recently had workshops where former dancers who were rusty could come back and polish up their skills. What a great concept and it worked for them. They have consistently had high numbers of visitors for this program.

We all have a part in the future of this activity. We can make it lots of fun, or we can watch it die a slow and painful death. Get involved in your club. Clubs in the same general area should work together. It's not a contest, it should be a collaborative effort, District directors, get out there and promote what is happening your districts. If you have two clubs with lessons, encourage the members and students from each club to interact with each other. Club members, when you visit, invite your new members to attend. Offer to drive someone to a half-way dance or other event. Clubs, keep your websites up to date. If you don't have a website, create a Facebook page. Social media is here and we need to use it. We all have to get out there and do our part to keep this activity alive.

## Sesquicentennial Promenaders Square Dance Club Tomball

The Sesquicentennial Promenaders Square Dance Club was officially formed April 1, 1985 under the direction of J. A. "Pete" and Elsie Seber and Johnny and Cindy Reagan. The club was officially sanctioned as the "Sesquicentennial Promenaders" by Mrs. Sherry McDonnell, General Chairman of the Tomball, Texas 1986 Tomball Sesquicentennial committee as being the official square dance club and Goodwill Ambassadors for Tomball, Texas. As such, Mrs. McDonnell authorized the use of the official Sesquicentennial logo as part of the club costumes and club banners.

The Charter Members of the club spent a good part of 1986 traveling throughout the area being Goodwill Ambassadors for Tomball and for Texas during the Sesquicentennial Year. They went to Austin for the Sesquicentennial Parade at the State Capital; were part of the entertainment at the Texas Rangers Museum; also were part of the Sesquicentennial Gala Ball at the Sheraton Crown Hotel; and hosted the Wagon Train at it's stopover in the area. The Calendar of Events in the Sesquicentennial Promenaders' Album (the First Ten Years) tells all of the events in which they participated. It also has the map of the parade route in Austin as well as the "Thank You" letter from the Texas Rangers' for participating in their portion of the celebration.

We are a part of the "ONLY club" commissioned by the Chamber of Commerce to the THE GOOD-WILL AMBASSADORS for Tomball, for Texas 150th birthday. We are the "ONLY club" whose badges have Goodwill Ambassador as a permanent part of the badge received upon graduation. We are the "ONLY club" who still wears the red, white and blue of the Texas flag as our club dress, because that was what we were "commissioned" to wear as Goodwill Ambassadors for Tomball and for Texas. The style of the club dress has changed over the years, but not the color.

### **HEARING ASSIST UNITS**

A number of clubs, callers and cuers are using hearing-assist systems. These systems consist of a transmitter that's hooked up to the sound system and receivers with ear-bud or ear-speaker worn by dancers. Dancers can purchase the receiver for around \$100.00 to \$160.00 depending on the model. The caller/cuer typically transmits voice signal (this is what most dancers who are hearing-impaired have trouble picking up).

An assistive listening system makes a wireless, electronic connection between the sound source and your ear. This "bridging" effect eliminates the effects of distance, background noise and reverberation so that you can hear and understand better; it's like having the sound source right next to you. If you are in the back of the room, the sound volume can be adjusted at your ear to be as loud as you want, without increasing the loudness of the background noise in the room. Even if the room is noisy or very reverberant, you should still be able to hear clearly, since the listening system is bypassing all the acoustical conditions in the room.
